THE ALZHEIMER'S CRISIS IN CALIFORNIA

LATINOS:

- Latinos are 1.5x more likely to have Alzheimer's or other dementias
- The number of Latinos living with Alzheimer's in California will triple by 2040

BLACK AMERICANS:

- Black Americans are 2x as likely to have Alzheimer's disease or other dementias
- The number of Black Americans living with Alzheimer's in California will triple by 2040

ASIAN AMERICANS/PACIFIC ISLANDERS:

- In 2019, 15% of Californians
 living with Alzheimer's were Asian
 American/Pacific Islander
- The number of Asian American/ Pacific Islanders living with Alzheimer's in California will more than double by 2040
