



## Disability Assistance – Application Process & Forms

This fact sheet explains the different types of disability income available to CA residents and how providers can assist patients with disabilities in their application process.

## **HOW HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS CAN ASSIST APPLICANTS**

State Disability Insurance (SDI) applicants need a physician/practitioner to complete a medical certification ("Part B" on Application Form DE 2501 - Claim for Disability Insurance Benefits to EDD).

Physicians/practitioners do **NOT** need to complete a form for first-time SSI/SSDI applicants.

Unlike SDI, SSA's Disability Determination Services make the decision on whether an applicant is disabled after a detailed review of their medical records. Physicians/practitioners can support SSI/SSDI applicants by ensuring their medical records contain detailed diagnosis and treatment, as well as statements about limitations to work or engage in substantial gainful activity.
